It was one of the hardest things I've had to do, to say good-bye to Marlon and Bridgy Sierra. I have worked very closely with this couple for over a year, training them in Deaf

ministry, Deaf culture, Honduran sign language (LESHO), and specifically how to teach Deaf people the Bible. They have grown tremendously, and were excited about starting a deaf ministry in April. Naturally that was impossible due to COVID-19 restrictions, but they have maintained contact with the local Deaf through social media and done what they can. Thank you for your prayers for this sweet couple as they stretch their small food supply between 3 children while ministering to others

during this difficult time!

Coronavirus has impacted many of our lives. In Honduras the borders were closed as of March 15th and currently remain closed. The government has enacted curfews since then to varying degrees, and little more than supermarkets, banks, pharmacies and hospitals have been open since. There were several days when even supermarkets were closed. In March the US embassy urged any American planning to fly to the US to do so immediately, and since I was planning to move to the US April 30th, we decided it was best to move up the date to March 30th, when a flight became available. I evacuated on a plane arranged between the US embassy and Honduran government, and my fiancé arranged for me to quarantine near his institute in Texas for 14 days. I had less than 24 hours to pack my belongings and say goodbye to a small handful of my closest friends. What a whirlwind! I am now staying with family in MD as we make final preparations for our wedding.
