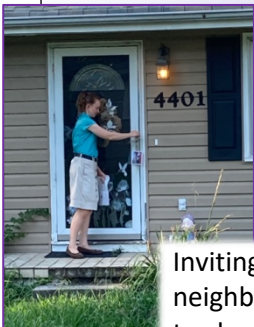

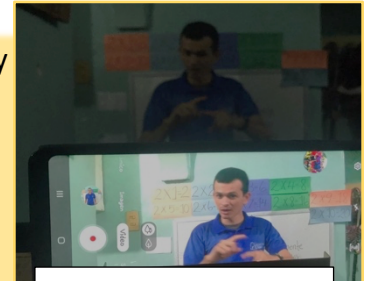

Honduras remains mostly closed as COVID cases continue rising. In El Progreso, people are legally allowed to drive on the roads once every 2 weeks to conduct essential business. Despite the difficulties, the Sierras (hearing couple I trained in sign language and deaf ministry) have continued to **reach out to the local Deaf** through social media. They are video recording lessons of Bible passages and Bible vocabulary in Honduran Sign Language (LESHO) and sending them to the Deaf who know LESHO. The Deaf have been very responsive and the Sierras report several good, spiritual conversations with Deaf people over video calls. They are also providing basic food items to deaf and their families, when allowed to do so. Please pray for wisdom and favor for this young couple as they navigate unusual circumstances.
