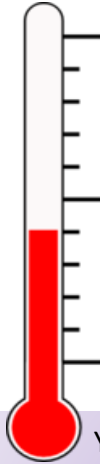




Marie LEA DEAF Hondurans



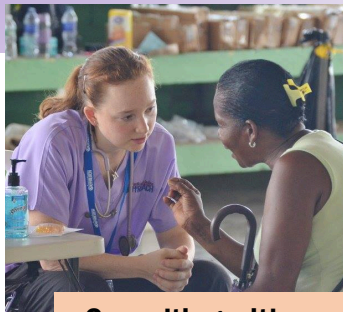
...and they that have not heard shall understand. Romans 15:21



I am receiving over **40% monthly support**, thanks to new supporting churches and families. THANK YOU so much for your generosity! I also appreciate your prayers for safety and open doors; God is answering. The next 6 months are booked with 1-3 presentations a week in several different states.

You may remember me mentioning the **National Interpreter Certification** exam over the last few months, and passing part 1 of the American Sign Language test. Unfortunately, the licensing organization has decided to suspend any further testing (part 1 or 2) indefinitely. Though this is disappointing, I am still grateful for the volumes I learned in preparation for the 1st exam, and God has opened the opportunity for me to begin learning LESHO (Honduran sign language) instead!

Thank you for your prayers concerning the upcoming **medical missions trip to Honduras** with Medical Missions Outreach. For reasons beyond our control, we will no longer be performing surgeries on this particular trip. We will still be providing basic medical and vision care for hundreds of patients, while giving a clear gospel message to each patient. Looking forward to introducing 4 of my brothers to Team Honduras, my future ministry partners, as well!

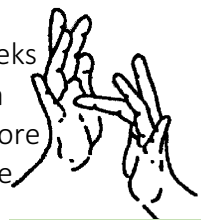

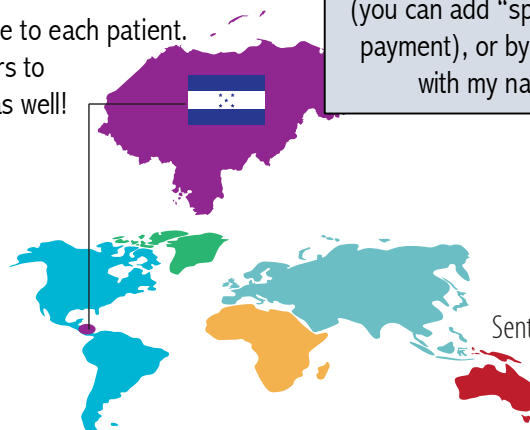
