Though our main focus for this year is on learning the spoken and written language of Romanian, God has kindly given us a few **Deaf/sign language opportunities** that continue to motivate us on our journey:

- The last Sunday in May, a Deaf man from outside Romania was visiting family in the area and attended the church that is sponsoring our missionary visas. Though American Sign Language (ASL) is not his first language, he had had some ASL exposure. Ben interpreted parts of the (English) church service into ASL and the Deaf man repeatedly thanked him.
- Also, at the end of May, Ben was able to have a short conversation with a Deaf Romanian in a food court (see picture) while the man was on break from work.
- We were put in contact with a Romanian woman who is a professional sign language interpreter in Romania and grew up with Deaf parents. At the end of June, we interviewed her for about 2 hours (in English), learning about both the Deaf culture here and

the interpreting world. She readily agreed to meet with us again. Please pray for God to continue to guide us to key individuals in the deaf community at the right times.
